The Space Torah project was founded in 2016 by Rachel Raz to preserve and share the journey of NASA astronaut Dr. Jeff Hoffman with communities around the globe. As part of the project, a short documentary was created by Verissima Productions with the leadership of Director Rob Cooper (Boston). The film was selected for over 40 film festivals in 10 countries around the world and won several awards. As part of the Project, the Jeff Hoffman's Collection and Archive was dedicated in the National Library of Israel and received recognition by the president of Israel. Educational resources have been developed and shared. The Space Torah Project is looking to expand its work in the future to continue with its mission and inspire many around the globe.

Synopsis

This film is the story of: how Dr. Jeffrey Hoffman realized a childhood dream by becoming an astronaut; how he was a key member of the spacewalking team that made critical repairs to the Hubble Space Telescope; how his own faith journey evolved as he took various Jewish objects on his five Space Shuttle missions; how his community came together to make it possible for

that small Torah to be with him on his final flight, when we read from the book of Genesis while soaring through space "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth."

Short

In 1996, NASA astronaut Dr. Jeffrey Hoffman brought a small Torah scroll on board Space Shuttle Colombia. On Shabbat, he read from the book of Genesis, while soaring through the firmament "In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth."

"בראשית ברא אלוקים את השמיים ואת הארץ"

Dr. Jeffrey Hoffman was the first male Jewish American astronaut to go into space. He became a NASA Astronaut in 1978; participated in five Space Shuttle mission; and was the first astronaut to log 1,000 hours aboard the Space Shuttle. He has performed four spacewalks, including the first unplanned, contingency spacewalk in NASA history (STS 51D - April, 1985) and the initial rescue mission for the Hubble Space Telescope (STS 61 - December, 1993).

During his five missions on the Shuttle, he chose to bring various sacred Jewish objects including <u>mezuzot</u> that he posted on the entrance to his sleep compartment; <u>dreidels</u> that he spun during Hanukkah; and <u>atarot</u> from his sons' <u>tallitot</u> that they used for their Bar-Mitzvahs...and years later, as chuppah covers at their weddings.

The highlight was the Torah he took with him on his fifth and final mission (STS 75 - February 1996). This fulfilled the vision of Jeff's Rabbi in Houston, Shaul Osadchey, who, after years of searching, was able to locate a small Torah scroll that, while being complete and Kosher, would also be small enough to fit into the limited space that astronauts were given for personal items.

When the Torah was returned to their Synagogue, Dr. Hoffman and Rabbi Osadchey held presentations for young people to help them appreciate the majesty of Torah and its ongoing significance in our lives. The Space Torah still used today for Bar and Bat Mitzvahs and for various other services, always making those services more special. As Dr. Hoffman likes to say, "It wasn't so much that going into Space made the Torah special as it was that the Torah made Space more special by going there."

The film has touched people from around the world -- Jews and non-Jews alike -- who have found wonder in the enduring holiness and power of bringing our most sacred human traditions with us, even as we go places where mankind has never been before.

Dr. Jeffrey Hoffman



Dr. Hoffman received a BA in Astronomy (summa cum laude) from Amherst College (1966); a PhD in Astrophysics from Harvard University (1971); and an MSc in Materials Science from Rice University (1988). He was a NASA astronaut from 1978-1997 and was the first astronaut to log 1000 hours of flight time aboard the Space Shuttle. Dr. Hoffman was Payload Commander of STS-46, the first flight of the US-Italian Tethered Satellite System. As the NASA representative for EVA, he helped develop and carry out tests of advanced space suit designs and new tools needed for the assembly of the International Space Station.

Dr. Hoffman also spent four years , in Paris as NASA's European Representative. For over 20 years has been on the faculty of MIT where he courses on space operations and space systems design. His primary interests are designing innovative space systems for human and robotic space exploration and improving the technology of space suits. He is currently Deputy Principal Investigator of the MOXIE experiment on NASA's Mars 2020 Perseverance Rover. Which for the first time produce oxygen on the surface of Mars using local resources.

Dr. Hoffman is director of the Mass. Space Grant Consortium, responsible for space-related educational activities. In 2007, Dr. Hoffman was elected to the US Astronaut Hall of Fame.

Rabbi Shaul Osadchey



Rabbi Osadchey was Dr. Hoffman's Rabbi while he was living in Houston and working at NASA. During his 30 years in Houston, Rabbi Osadchey has championed various Jewish and social justice issues including: traveling to the former USSR to support Jewish refuseniks; developing the first Jewish AIDS Care Team; co-chairing the United Way Campaign for the Homeless; officiating at the first same-sex Jewish marriage ceremony in Houston, and being an Advisory Board member of the AFL-CIO Union Community Fund. It was because of Rabbi Osadchey's inspiration and persistence in obtaining the miniature Torah that is was available for Dr. Hoffman to be able to bring it along on the Space Shuttle flight.

For ten years, Rabbi Osadchey's served in Calgary, where he founded the Calgary Interfaith Council. For this work, he was awarded the 2017 Gold Medal by King Abdullah II of Jordan for UN World Interfaith Harmony Week. As Co-Chair of the Habitat for Humanity Interfaith Build Project he raised \$1 million for affordable homes for low-income families. Rabbi Osadchey also helped found the Joint Interfaith Task Force Against Hatred and Violence in Calgary. He is past-president of the Calgary Council of Christians and Jews and co-founded the Calgary Jewish-Muslim Council, where rabbis and imams meet to address common concerns and to promote mutual respect and understanding.



Janna Kaplan M.S. is Lecturer in Psychology and Sr. Research Associate at Brandeis University's Ashton Graybiel Spatial Orientation Lab, specializing in Neuropsychology and Space Research where Janna studies human adaptation to various conditions of space flight such as: non-Earth planetary gravitational environments; artificial gravity; virtual environments; movement control; spatial orientation; and space motion sickness. Her primary field is the study of human factors in moving and virtual environments including sensorimotor human factors in and interplanetary spaceflight, spaceflight-analog and planetary environments, as well as nautical and aeronautic vehicles.

Janna's undergraduate and graduate degrees are from the University of Leningrad (now, St. Petersburg). She came to the US as a Jewish refugee from Russia in 1982, fleeing state sponsored anti-Semitic violence as well as intellectual and cultural suppression.



The Space Torah (which measures 7" in height and 4" in diameter) became possible when Rabbi Shaul Osadchey -- Dr. Hoffman's rabbi at Congregation Or Hadash, who'd been dreaming about what it would be like for Jeff to take a Torah on a Space Shuttle flight -- set out to find one that would fit into the small personal space each astronaut is given. He was ultimately able to get it from the Klein Brothers of Brooklyn., NY. It was, in fact, a new Torah originally purchased in Israel by Rabbi Moshe Klein from Yichyeh Sharabi, a Yemenite Jewish scribe. Since returning to earth, the Space Torah has resided in a specially designated place within the ark of the sanctuary of Congregation Or Ami, the successor to Congregation Or Hadash. It is still used for Bar and Bat Mitzvahs and on other special occasions.
